Janna Gol was born in Havelte, the Netherlands, on 17 November 1960. She graduated from Rijks Scholen Gemeenschap (RSG) Meppel in 1979 and started studying cultural anthropology at Utrecht University. In her third year she did anthropological field work in a primary care practice in an immigrant neighborhood in Utrecht. It was the GP of this practice who motivated her to study medicine. She completed her medical training in 1991 and continued as a medical doctor in a psychiatric unit of a general hospital. Subsequently she worked in child and adolescent psychiatry, then in neurology, and again in child and adolescent psychiatry in an academic setting (AZG). From 1995 to 1998 she was trained as a psychiatrist by Jan Pols at psychiatric hospital “Licht en Kracht” in Assen. She graduated in child and adolescent psychiatry in 1999. After that, she worked in different fields of psychiatry: part-time at Accare Groningen (child and adolescent psychiatry) and FPK Assen (forensic psychiatry) subsequently at Psychotherapeutic Centre “de Viersprong“, Halsteren (psychotherapy) and GZZ Westelijk Noord Brabant, Bergen op Zoom (transitional psychiatry, an innovative project). Since 2005 she works at the departments of internal medicine and psychiatry at University Medical Center Groningen (UMCG), with a focus on patients with functional somatic symptoms.
