# About the author

Luc van Lonkhuijzen was born by a timely vacuum extraction on 9 August 1970. In 1988 he passed his final exams Gymnasium at the Coornhert Gymnasium in Gouda. During the same year, he commenced his study Medicine at the Rijksuniversiteit Leiden. During his studies he did a research project in Nyanje Mission Hospital in Zambia. This made such a lasting impression that he decided to pursue a career in tropical Medicine. After his qualifying exam in 1996, he started with the course in Tropical Medicine. It consisted of a two-year rotation in surgery, with dr A C H Boissevain, dr R Weller and dr W F van Tets, and obstetrics and gynecology, under dr J T M van der Schoot, at the St Lucas Andreas hospital in Amsterdam, followed by a three-month course with the Netherlands School of Public Health.

After two years they moved to Malawi where he worked in Mulanje Mission hospital as Deputy Medical Director with dr B Sizoo.

In October 2003, he started specialist training Gynecology and Obstetrics at Groningen University. He was trained at the Deventer Ziekenhuis, Deventer (dr P J Q van der Linden), the University Medical Center Groningen (prof dr M J Heineman and prof. dr M. J E Mourits) and the Martini Ziekenhuis Groningen (dr A J van Loon). In 2009, he started with his Masters in Public Health at the Dalla Lana school of Public health as part of his fellowship in Gynaecologic Oncology at the University of Toronto, Canada (prof. A. Covens).

Currently, he is doing his rotations as a fellow at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Center and Princess Margaret hospital in Toronto, Canada.
