Prof. Dr. Götz Wietasch completed his PhD-thesis on 'Double indicator dilution technique for quantification of cardiac output and left-to-right shunts' in 1996 at the University of Göttingen, Germany. After finishing medical school, he moved to Bonn University to become an anaesthesiologist. He developed a quantitative research portfolio in cardiovascular physiology, pharmacokinetics and -dynamics.

In 2004 Götz Wietasch moved to University Medical Centre in Groningen where he has shifted his focus from biomedical research to research on innovations in medical education. Currently, he heads a group of PhD-students working on several projects with focus on transition and personal development, exploring training methods, and measurement of training quality.

He was chairmen of the national training accreditation program commission and had positions in several national committees to support the transition of the Dutch training accreditation system. He was advisor in curriculum design in under grade and post grade medical education. He is involved in several national committees and projects regarding postgraduate training reform.

He practices as an anaesthesiologist, leading academic teacher, and is certified trainer for pre and post graduate medical education.
